The establishment of Lilabati Mahavidyalaya has bridged this gap, providing local students with an opportunity to pursue their academic goals close to home. The college is named in honor of the late Lilabati Ghosh Dastidar and her family—Sri Mihir Ghosh Dastidar, Sri Tushar Ghosh Dastidar, Sri Tarun Kanti Ghosh Dastidar, Sri Amitava Ghosh Dastidar, Smt. Mallika Ghosh Dastidar (Guha), Smt. Soumi Ghosh Dastidar (Mitra), and Smt. Somali Roy—who generously donated the land.

Sanctioned by the Department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal, and affiliated with the University of North Bengal, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya is committed to fostering innovative ideas and specialized knowledge. Institutional Weakness

- **1. Rural Location:** The remote setting of the college limits access and opportunities for students, posing a significant disadvantage.
- **2. Professional Course Feasibility:** The introduction of professional courses is improbable due to the financial constraints faced by the majority of students.
- **3. Socio-Economic Barriers:** General poverty and a lack of parental education and awareness hinder many aspiring first-generation learners from pursuing higher education.
- **4. Staffing Challenges:** The slow government recruitment process has led to a critical shortage of permanent teaching and non-teaching staff.
- **5. Faculty Workload:** The shortage of sanctioned faculty posts results in increased workload for teachers, restricting their ability to engage in research activities and limiting research output.

- **6. Competitive Exam Performance:** Poor performance in NET/SET and other competitive exams affects students' placement prospects negatively.
- **7. Alumni Engagement:** Increased participation and support from alumni are needed to address various challenges and enhance institutional development.
- **8. Industry Interaction:** The lack of nearby industries and the limited interest from existing ones in active collaboration restrict industry-institution engagement.
- **9.** Collaborative Research: Insufficient interdisciplinary research and limited collaborations with other institutions and industry partners hinder academic progress.
- **10. Placement Opportunities:** Scarcity of on-campus consultative and placement opportunities, coupled with low interest from reputed organizations, demotivates students.
- **11. Language Proficiency:** Language barriers among students impact their job prospects and overall academic performance.
- **12. Absence of Key Facilities:** The lack of science and commerce streams, student hostels, and staff quarters are notable deficiencies that need to be addressed.
- **13. Funding Limitations:** There is a need for additional funding agencies and increased financial support for infrastructure development to enhance the overall quality of education and facilities at the college.

Institutional Opportunity

- **1. Expansion of Higher Education:** The college can leverage its location in a backward catchment area to extend higher education opportunities to marginalized and underserved sections of society.
- **2. ICT Integration:** The COVID-19 pandemic has highlighted the need for innovative ICT-supported teaching and learning methods, offering an opportunity for both students and faculty to adapt to e-learning environments and digital content.
- **3. Skill-Based Programs:** There is an opportunity to introduce more skill-based programs to enhance students' employability and prepare them for a competitive job market.
- **4. Research Opportunities:** The college can explore research opportunities within the Indian knowledge system, focusing on local culture, language, and art forms, contributing to the preservation and advancement of regional knowledge.
- **5. Interdisciplinary Courses:** Introducing interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary courses can enrich the academic curriculum and provide students with a broader range of knowledge and skills.
- **6. Science Stream:** There is potential for the introduction of a Science stream, which would expand academic offerings and attract a wider student base.
- 7. Industry-Institution Collaboration: Creating employment opportunities through enhanced industry-

institution interaction can benefit students by providing practical experience and fostering stronger industry ties.

- **8. Alumni Engagement:** Strengthening the Alumni Association's involvement in academic affairs and career counseling can bolster the college's social capital and offer valuable guidance and support to current students.

Institutional Challenge

- **1. Introduction of Science Stream:** One of the major challenges is introducing a science stream due to the absence of a feeder higher secondary school in the catchment area, which limits the pipeline of prospective students.
- **2.** Curriculum Limitations: Despite efforts to implement the Choice-Based Credit System (CBCS), the limited range of disciplines restricts the availability of elective papers, impacting the full realization of CBCS's objectives.
- **3. Infrastructure and Research Constraints:** Insufficient infrastructure, a remote location, and limited funds serve as significant barriers to faculty engagement in meaningful research activities.
- **4. Meeting Global Standards:** The college's remote location and inadequate resources make it challenging to meet global academic standards and fully implement advanced educational practices.
- **5. Internet Connectivity:** Poor internet connectivity hinders the effective delivery of online programs and teaching activities, limiting access to digital learning resources.
- **6. High Dropout Rates:** Poverty among students leads to high dropout rates, particularly in program courses, posing a significant challenge to maintaining student retention and success.
- **7. Placement Difficulties:** Securing job placements for students is challenging due to the limited local environment and the absence of active industry ties.
- **8. Financial Constraints:** Scarcity of financial resources in relation to the needs for maintenance and institutional growth presents a severe challenge for sustaining and advancing the college's facilities and services.
- **9. Implementation of NEP 2020:** Achieving the standards required for the implementation of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 is a formidable challenge, given the existing institutional limitations.
- 10. Recruitment Delays: The slow recruitment process by the government exacerbates the challenge of filling sanctioned teaching and technical positions, impacting the college's operational efficiency and academic delivery.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The academic progress at Lilabati Mahavidyalaya is systematically managed through the preparation of academic calendars, general schedules, and departmental plans. The college prioritizes timely syllabus completion and regularly reviews progress to ensure objectives are met. Over the past five years, faculty members have effectively incorporated educational technology alongside traditional teaching methods. In addition to following the affiliating university's prescribed courses, the college has introduced an add-on course addressing local and international issues, seamlessly integrating these topics into the academic framework.

Lilabati Mahavidyalaya maintains an accessible feedback system for students, parents, and other stakeholders to continuously improve academic practices. The college plays a crucial role in shaping the curriculum of the University of North Bengal, with faculty members actively participating in workshops, seminars, and curriculum development initiatives. Since adopting the National Education Policy (NEP) in 2023, the college has realigned its curriculum to comply with NEP guidelines, integrating Multi-Disciplinary Courses, Value-Added Courses, and add-on courses to ensure a well-rounded educational experience.

Recognizing the importance of vocational training and skill enhancement, the college has incorporated compulsory Skill Enhancement Courses, bridging the gap between its existing course structure and the NEP 2020 framework. In its pursuit of excellence, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya advocates for a blend of traditional and modern teaching methodologies. While traditional methods like chalk-and-board are valued, the college also embraces technology through virtual classrooms to create an interactive and immersive learning environment.

Annual seminars featuring experts from various fields provide students with valuable career guidance and contemporary perspectives. Beyond academics, the college emphasizes holistic education by commemorating national events such as Republic Day, Independence Day, Environment Day, and Women's Day through diverse co-curricular activities. These initiatives aim to broaden students' horizons, foster a sense of civic responsibility, and deepen cultural appreciation, aligning with the college's educational objectives.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

Lilabati Mahavidyalaya follows the guidelines set by North Bengal University and the Department of Higher Education to meticulously manage its admission process through a dedicated Admission Committee. The college ensures a transparent, merit-based admission process for both Honours and Program Courses based on the final merit list.

Our academic framework aligns with directives from the Government of West Bengal and North Bengal University. For the academic year 2023-2024, we proudly have a faculty of 20 permanent teachers, with over half holding advanced qualifications such as PhD, NET, and SET. To foster an informed learning environment, students receive their course syllabi on the first day of class, setting clear expectations and aiding in effective comprehension.

The college leverages technology by offering regular digital classes to enhance the teaching-learning experience and promote student engagement. In addition to traditional resources, students have access to the N-

list site, a comprehensive digital repository that includes books, articles, magazines, and study materials. Our library is equipped with KOHA ILMS and features Wi-Fi and CCTV surveillance for security.

We address diverse learning needs through remedial classes, which are essential for providing additional support to students. The college maintains a rigorous evaluation process overseen by the Examination Committee to ensure transparency and fairness. Internal assessments include group discussions, class tests, unit tests, paper presentations, assignments, viva-voce, and projects. Any grievances related to internal assessments are addressed promptly and transparently.

The Academic Council, in collaboration with the Heads of Departments, formulates guidelines for implementing the timetable, extra classes, remedial sessions, and internal assessments. Student progression to the next semester is determined by Semesters conducted by North Bengal University, reflecting our commitment to academic rigor and high standards.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Lilabati Mahavidyalaya cultivates a vibrant culture of continuous learning, research, and innovation, fostering an environment where both faculty and management inspire and guide students. Our commitment to research is demonstrated by the active involvement of faculty in ongoing research projects and scholarly publications. The college supports faculty development by adjusting teaching loads and granting duty leaves to those pursuing doctoral degrees. Currently, few faculty members hold doctoral degrees, with several others advancing through their PhD coursework at affiliated and other universities.

We regularly organize webinars, seminars, workshops, and lectures, featuring subject experts who share their insights. Faculty members are encouraged to participate in external seminars and contribute to scholarly publications, including books with ISBN recognition. This balance between teaching responsibilities and research activities highlights the college's dedication to academic excellence and professional growth.

Our enthusiasm for extension activities is evident in a variety of programs designed to enrich both academic and cultural experiences for students. Annual events such as the Youth Parliament and poster presentations stimulate scientific curiosity and innovation. The National Service Scheme (NSS) units are integral to our social responsibility efforts, conducting numerous community welfare, health awareness, and environmental conservation programs over the past five years.

Additionally, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Academic Council actively encourage faculty members to offer consultancy services to students, aiding in career planning and development. This comprehensive approach to education and student support ensures that Lilabati Mahavidyalaya remains a beacon of learning, research, and community engagement.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Spanning 4.77 acres, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya features a developing infrastructure tailored to support both academic and extracurricular activities. The college covers a constructed area of 9,105 sq. meters, providing a range of amenities designed for effective learning and personal development.

The campus includes 14 spacious classrooms and a state-of-the-art Smart Room with advanced audio-visual

systems, projectors, and Wi-Fi connectivity. Essential notifications are regularly updated on our fully functional website. Classrooms are equipped with blackboards, tables, benches, and proper lighting to create a conducive learning environment.

The institution offers a dedicated IQAC Room and provides 30 computers for student use, supported by a LAN and Wi-Fi network with 100 MBPS bandwidth, courtesy of Alliance Broadband. For physical activities, the campus features a playground, volleyball court, and areas designated for javelin throw and shot put, catering to both recreational and competitive sports.

Our library boasts an extensive collection of reference books, textbooks, and newspapers. Faculty members have access to N-LIST subscriptions, providing a wealth of online e-books and e-journals. Equipped with KOHA ILMS and RFID technology, the library also features Wi-Fi and CCTV surveillance for enhanced security.

Additional amenities include a roofed parking facility for two-wheelers, separate chambers for the Principal, IQAC, Administrative Office, Staff Room, and Girls' Common Room. The college prioritizes the well-being of students and staff by offering filtered drinking water facilities with strategically placed water purifiers.

Safety measures include generators, solar photovoltaic devices, fire extinguishers, and comprehensive CCTV surveillance, ensuring a secure and comfortable environment. The campus also features a well-equipped gym, a canteen, and a rainwater harvesting system, reflecting our commitment to fostering holistic development and well-being.

Student Support and Progression

At Lilabati Mahavidyalaya, inclusivity and support for students from diverse socio-economic backgrounds are core principles. Recognizing the financial challenges faced by some students, the college offers various forms of support, including access to government scholarships such as KANYASHREE PRAKALPA, designed to reduce dropout rates among unmarried female students. Additional schemes like OASIS for SC/ST/OBC students, AIKYASHREE, SVMCM, and the Hon'ble Chief Minister's Relief Fund further assist in supporting education and minimizing dropout rates among marginalized groups.

To ensure a harmonious and supportive learning environment, the college has established dedicated committees for Grievance Redressal, Prevention of Sexual Harassment, and Anti-Ragging. These committees are committed to addressing concerns and safeguarding students' well-being.

Over the past five years, many of our alumni have earned MA degrees and found careers as educators, entrepreneurs, or professionals in various sectors. To boost students' employability, the college offers add-on courses focusing on basic ICT skills, including internet use, email communication, and online form filling.

Maintaining strong connections with alumni, the college actively engages them through an Alumni Association, which provides mentorship and career guidance opportunities. Our Anti-Ragging Committee ensures a ragging-free campus, while the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) addresses any harassment issues promptly, reinforcing our commitment to a safe and respectful campus environment.

Promoting holistic development, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya organizes a variety of cultural and sports events, encouraging students to showcase their talents. Additionally, students are motivated to participate in district and

state-level competitions, offering them opportunities for growth, recognition, and personal development.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Lilabati Mahavidyalaya operates under the strategic guidance of a Governing Body, which includes the President, Principal, University Nominees, a representative from the West Bengal State Council of Higher Education, Government Nominees, and both teaching and non-teaching members. It periodically reviews progress and initiates corrective measures as needed.

The Principal manages the day-to-day academic and administrative affairs, executing policies approved by the Governing Body. cultivate well-rounded individuals. This approach aims to develop a diverse set of skills—academic, intellectual, aesthetic, social, physical, emotional, and ethical—within an integrated framework. Departments such as English, Bengali, History, Political Science and Education, work collaboratively to create a dynamic and cohesive learning environment. For instance, the Philosophy department offers a course titled "Mental Wellness & Yoga," which synthesizes knowledge from multiple disciplines. Humanities departments also contribute through certificate courses and specialized programs that focus on skill development and personal growth. In alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP), the college has

introduced vocational and professional training courses, including Yoga and Self-Defense, to highlight their interdisciplinary relevance. The Career Counselling Cell organizes workshops and seminars to equip students with the skills necessary for the job market, while the NSS units promote social responsibility. Our commitment to a multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary approach extends across all undergraduate programs, including basic, professional, and vocational disciplines, ensuring comprehensive student development. We also emphasize practical learning experiences by facilitating internships with local industries and businesses, thereby enhancing students' practical knowledge and career readiness.

2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

Lilabati Mahavidyalaya is proactively preparing to implement the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system, as outlined in the National Education Policy (NEP). This forward-thinking framework will offer undergraduate students flexible entry and exit points throughout their courses, allowing them to integrate education with employment opportunities and potentially reduce dropout rates. Students will have the option to exit a program after achieving any level of qualification and return later to complete their studies within a specified timeframe. The ABC system supports a blended learning approach, enabling students to earn credits from various higher education institutions registered with the scheme through platforms like SWAYAM, MOOCs, and NPTEL. To facilitate this, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya is encouraging both faculty and students to engage with these national platforms to enhance academic and practical knowledge. While awaiting official authorization, we have begun discussions with our affiliating university to integrate the ABC system into our skill-oriented programs as an initial step. Additionally, we have signed Memoranda of Understanding (MOUs) with several institutions and are exploring both traditional and online channels to maximize the benefits of ABC for our students and those from other colleges within a unified system. Implementing the ABC system at the degree level will require extensive collaboration among institutions and regulatory bodies. It has the potential to revolutionize credit transfer across universities and recognize credits earned through non-traditional

courses. Lilabati Mahavidyalaya has partnered with numerous academic and research institutes to offer a range of certificate programs and value-added courses, aligning with the core objectives of the ABC system. Our affiliating university's admission advisory has highlighted the forthcoming introduction of the ABC system, emphasizing its importance for modernizing and enhancing the flexibility of higher education. To support a smooth transition, we have established our own digital locker system where students can enter necessary details. Since 2021, we have been considering forming clusters with other colleges to further benefit our students and potentially implement ABC through these collaborative networks. By registering on elearning platforms such as SWAYAM, NPTEL, and other MOOC sites, our students are positioned to gain substantial advantages. Many of our faculty members have also registered on these platforms to mentor and assist students, thereby enriching our educational environment. The implementation of the ABC system at Lilabati Mahavidyalaya represents a transformative step towards a more flexible and inclusive educational framework. By embracing blended learning, enhancing credit transfer mechanisms, and fostering collaborations, we aim to provide our students with a robust, adaptable, and comprehensive education that effectively prepares them for the future.

3. Skill development:

The National Education Policy (NEP) prioritizes the holistic development of youth, aiming to increase the Gross Enrollment Ratio and enhance skill development to support the objectives of Atmanirbhar Bharat. In alignment with this vision, our institution, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), has implemented several initiatives to enrich both knowledge and soft skills among students. We have introduced a range of skill development activities designed to bolster various competencies. These include spot reading, language skills enhancement, and competitions such as "Build Your Confidence with English," which aim to improve communicative abilities. These partnerships are crucial for providing students with hands-on experiences and mentoring sessions focused on skill development to enhance employability prospects. Our institution places a strong emphasis on skill development, working with reputable academic and business organizations to foster a proactive and forward-thinking approach. Additionally, life skills activities, such as gymnasium workouts and yoga classes, contribute to students' mental strength, health, and positive outlook. By integrating these diverse skill-building activities and fostering a supportive environment for practical learning, we aim to equip our students with the tools they need to succeed in their careers and contribute effectively to society.

4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):

Hindi, Nepali, Political Science, Education, History, Philosophy, and other programs are designed to promote an understanding of diverse philosophical viewpoints and encourage intellectual coexistence. Departments like History and Philosophy focus on fostering intellectual growth aligned with IKS, helping students grasp varied economic and geopolitical contexts. Lilabati Mahavidyalaya continuously evolves by integrating new concepts, theories, and technological advances into its strategic planning while remaining deeply rooted in foundational values. In addition to our core curriculum, we offer sixteen Certificate, Addon, and Value-Added courses that impart knowledge of Indian heritage, scientific advancements, and professional skills. These courses also foster a deep appreciation for national and regional cultures and heritages. This comprehensive educational approach ensures that our students are well-prepared to contribute meaningfully to both local and global communities.

5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

Outcome-Based Education (OBE) represents a transformative approach in which learner-centered methods and clear learning outcomes are paramount. At Lilabati Mahavidyalaya, we have embraced this approach by implementing the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and aligning with the National Education Policy 2020 (NEP) through the newly introduced Four-Year Undergraduate Programme (FYUGP). This customization of education allows us to cater to students' individual interests, abilities, and skill development, thereby promoting participative and innovative learning. Our educational framework is meticulously structured into four stages: planning, doing, checking, and acting. This ensures that our academic strategies are consistently aligned with the institution's mission and vision. We design Course Outcomes (COs) and Programme Outcomes (POs) to meet the objectives set by North Bengal University. To facilitate this, we employ a range of innovative teaching methods, including ICT-based instruction, extension lectures, seminars, workshops, field trips, group discussions, quizzes, and student-led presentations. These diverse strategies enhance academic flexibility, foster critical thinking, and promote effective reasoning, underscoring our commitment to OBE. Continuous assessment plays a

support real-time discussions, group activities, and seminar presentations. Lilabati Mahavidyalaya's commitment to advancing online education underscores our dedication to maintaining educational continuity and flexibility, striving to provide a robust and inclusive learning experience that prepares students for future challenges.

The ELC acts as a representative body, with selected departments and cells nominating students to engage in discussions on a wide range of sociopolitical issues, fostering a democratic perspective among the student body. All students are considered members of the ELC, though a select group serves as representatives. The primary mission of the ELC is to deepen students' understanding of democratic

processes. Through various activities and discussions, the club aims to prepare students to be active, informed, and responsible participants in electoral systems at both local and national levels. By engaging in these initiatives, the ELC strives to enhance students' awareness and involvement in the democratic process.

3. What innovative programmes and initiatives undertaken by the ELCs? These may include voluntary contribution by the students in electoral processes-participation in voter registration of students and communities where they come from, assisting district election administration in conduct of poll, voter awareness campaigns, promotion of ethical voting, enhancing participation of the under privileged sections of society especially transgender, commercial sex workers, disabled persons, senior citizens, etc.

The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) at Lilabati Mahavidyalaya is dedicated to enhancing democratic participation and awareness among students and the wider community. Our initiatives are meticulously planned in alignment with guidelines from the Election Commission of India (ECI) and directives from the District Election Officer (DEO) of Alipurduar. Key activities of the ELC include a comprehensive awareness program focused on voter registration and empowerment. This program encourages students and local community members to register to vote, educates them about the electoral process, and informs them of their rights and responsibilities. In collaboration with the Department of Political Science and in adherence to guidelines from the District Magistrate's office, the ELC organizes a Youth Parliament. This platform enables students to participate in debates and discussions on critical national and international issues, simulating the parliamentary process and enhancing their understanding of governance. The ELC also celebrates National Voters Day each year by hosting workshops, guest lectures, and interactive sessions that emphasize the importance of every vote and encourage active participation in the electoral process. Through these initiatives, the ELC aims to foster a deeper understanding of democratic values and encourage students to practice these principles, ultimately contributing to the development of a wellinformed, responsible, and proactive electorate.

The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) at Lilabati Mahavidyalaya collaborates closely with the District Election Office to enhance community engagement in the electoral process, with a particular focus on voter registration and enrollment. The ELC undertakes several key initiatives to support these objectives. Firstly, the ELC plays an active role in voter registration drives organized by the District Election Office. Faculty and student volunteers assist community members with completing registration

Secondly, the ELC organizes awareness drives in partnership with the District Election Office. These events include educational presentations on the importance of voter registration, the significance of each vote, and an overview of the electoral process. Interactive sessions allow students to engage with election officials, ask questions, and resolve any doubts about voting. Additionally, the ELC facilitates enrollment assistance by setting up registration booths on campus and guiding students through the registration process. These efforts not only enhance students' understanding of their democratic responsibilities but also serve as a vital community resource for electoral engagement. Through these initiatives, the ELC aims to cultivate a more informed and active electorate, contributing to a vibrant and functioning democracy.

At Lilabati Mahavidyalaya, effective curriculum planning and delivery are achieved through a comprehensive and well-documented process that emphasizes organization and continuous improvement. At the start of each academic year, the institution meticulously prepares an Academic Calendar outlining key academic events such as session dates, internal examinations, holidays, and important activities like College Foundation Day and Annual Sports Day. This calendar, made available on the College website, ensures transparency and keeps students, faculty, and staff informed about upcoming events.

Curriculum planning involves structured collaboration among academic departments. Departmental meetings are held to discuss and finalize teaching schedules, topic distribution, and instructional strategies. Each department develops detailed lesson plans aligned with the university's curriculum framework, ensuring a comprehensive educational experience through diverse teaching methods and resources. To monitor and enhance student learning outcomes, the college employs continuous internal assessments, including regular class tests, assignments, and student seminars. These assessments provide timely feedback to students, helping them identify areas for improvement and reinforcing their understanding of course material.

Documentation and review are integral to the process, with detailed records maintained of all academic activities, including lesson plans, assessment results, and feedback mechanisms. These records are periodically reviewed to ensure alignment with learning outcomes and institutional goals, and data from internal assessments is analyzed to adjust teaching strategies and curriculum content for improved effectiveness.

In addition, Lilabati Mahavidyalaya adheres to the curriculum set by the University of North Bengal, with faculty members participating in the Board of Studies to integrate their suggestions. The IQAC prepares the Academic Calendar in consultation with institutional authorities, aligning it with university requirements and including key dates and events. Class schedules are designed by the Routine Committee and are complemented by a mix of ICT tools, audio-visual aids, and traditional teaching methods. Practical classes and tutorial sessions address individual paper requirements, and special sessions for slow learners and mentorship programs are organized to support students' academic challenges.

The College Library supports learning with resources such as question papers, study materials, e-books, and IT facilities. Continuous evaluation methods, including class tests and assignments, are complemented by annual test examinations, with results displayed on Departmental Notice Boards. Response:

At Lilabati Mahavidyalaya, integrating crosscutting issues such as Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, and Environment and Sustainability is fundamental to our curriculum design and delivery, ensuring a well-rounded educational experience for our students. These themes are intricately embedded throughout academic life, promoting a comprehensive understanding of these essential areas.

Professional Ethics are incorporated into the curriculum through courses that emphasize ethical practices and responsibilities. For instance, our Philosophy courses delve into ethical theories and moral philosophy, while specialized seminars and workshops on topics like Intellectual Property Rights provide practical insights into professional conduct. This approach aims to cultivate a strong sense of integrity and ethical behavior, equipping students to address professional challenges with responsibility and transparency.

Gender issues are addressed across multiple disciplines to foster awareness and understanding of gender equality. Courses in Political Science, English, Bengali, Philosophy, and History explore Gender Rights, Feminism, Ecofeminism, and Women Empowerment. Discussions on social issues such as domestic violence and gender inequality are integral to the curriculum. Additionally, the Internal Complaints Committee organizes seminars and activities for International Women's Day, and the NSS conducts awareness programs on gender issues. These efforts create a respectful and inclusive environment, preparing students to advocate for gender equity in both their personal and professional lives.

Human Values are woven into subjects that tackle social and ethical issues. Courses in Political Science and Philosophy cover topics such as social justice, humanism, and ethical debates on euthanasia and suicide, while Human Geography provides insights into social processes and well-being. 2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time-bound and efficient

Response:

As an affiliated institution of the University of North Bengal (NBU), Lilabati Mahavidyalaya strictly adheres to the regulations set forth by the university, particularly under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) implemented since the Academic Session 2018-2019. This system provides a comprehensive and transparent evaluation of student performance, ensuring academic rigor and fairness.

Assessment weightage at the college is distinctly outlined. For theoretical courses, internal assessments account for 20% of the total grade, while End Semester Examinations (ESE) contribute 80%. For practical-based courses, internal assessments comprise 60% of the grade, with ESE making up the remaining 40%. This approach reflects the importance of both theoretical and practical learning.

Continuous internal assessment forms a key part of the evaluation process. Various methods are employed, including multiple-choice questions (MCQs), projects, objective-type questions, open book exams, viva voce, student seminars, and assignments. These diverse methods cater to different learning styles and competencies, ensuring a thorough assessment of student understanding and skills.

Attendance plays a crucial role in the assessment criteria. A minimum attendance of 75% is required for examination eligibility, with attendance-based marks allocated as follows: 2 marks for 75% to below 80%, 3 marks for 80% to below 85%, 4 marks for 85% to below 90%, and 5 marks for 90% and above. This policy emphasizes the importance of regular attendance for academic success.

The internal assessment breakdown includes 10 marks designated for internal tasks and 5 marks based on attendance, ensuring both academic performance and class participation are considered in final evaluations. Internal assessment marks are submitted online through NBU's Marks Capture Portal, promoting transparency and efficiency.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, examination modalities transitioned to an online format. Faculty members provided continuous guidance, and marks were promptly updated on the university portal, demonstrating the institution's adaptability and commitment to maintaining academic standards amid disruptions.

Parent-teacher meetings are held each semester to review student progress and identify additional support needs. During the pandemic, these meetings were conducted online, ensuring ongoing communication between faculty and parents to support students effectively.

A dedicated Grievance and Redressal Committee addresses student complaints with transparency and efficiency. The committee meets regularly to resolve issues, ensuring that grievances are managed fairly.

The examination cell, comprising teaching and non-teaching staff, upholds examination integrity. Opportunities for student improvement are provided through assignments, mock tests, and remedial classes. Faculty regularly discuss performance with students, offering feedback and guidance to enhance understanding and academic outcomes.

Orientation sessions at the start of each academic year brief students on the evaluation structure and processes, ensuring clarity. The Exam Committee manages the dissemination of notices, guidelines, and updates through the college website, notice boards, classrooms, and dedicated WhatsApp groups for each semester.

With the introduction of the National Education Policy (NEP) in 2023, the university adopted a semester system, revising internal assessments to include a mix of internal assessments, tutorials/practicals, and oral tests. Faculty members prepare question papers for assessments, and after evaluation, marks are uploaded, with answer scripts securely maintained and accessible to students for review.

The shift to online examinations during the pandemic was managed effectively, maintaining academic

standards. The college's robust grievance redressal and administrative support mechanisms address any registration or marks discrepancies, guiding students through the University's RTI/PPR and Scrutiny/PPS procedures for resolution.

The campus is equipped with six projectors for instructional use, and Wi-Fi connectivity with a bandwidth of 100 MBPS through Alliance Broadband is available. The institution also has 10 laptops, 30 desktops, 30 UPS units, and seven printers. Specially equipped seminar rooms include LCD projectors, screens, and sound systems to facilitate presentations. The Language Lab supports language learning, while the IQAC room, teachers' common room, and administrative block each have computers to support their functions. The library features three computers—one for the librarian and two at the circulation desk—and provides access to the N-LIST facility, which includes e-journals and e-books. These resources are systematically organized using the Dewey Decimal Classification (DDC) 19th edition, facilitating easy navigation and access. The open-access system ensures that both students and faculty can efficiently locate and utilize the materials they need.

Since 2024, the library has significantly expanded its academic resources by providing access to N-LIST (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content). 6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Payments are primarily made via cheque or demand draft, with smaller transactions handled in cash, ensuring a structured and accountable approach to financial management and resource allocation.
